FLC Calls Pastor Tim O'Shields

Greetings to all of you at First Lutheran Church in Fergus Falls! This is Pastor Tim. I am counting the days until I get over there to serve First Lutheran, and to get to know all of you in person. Until then, I have heard that many of you want to know more about me.

I was born in Greenville, South Carolina. When I was 9 years old, we relocated to the Augusta, Georgia area, where my grandparents had a thriving business. My parents transitioned to take over that business. The "store" was like Hobby Lobby, Joanne's Fabrics, and a Home Interiors Store all combined. I have one brother (an entrepreneur), who lives with his wife (surgeon specializing in GYN), and their rescue dog (Lacey). They live on a large reservoir that splits the border of South Carolina and Georgia, and spills into the Savannah River. They love food and drink, travel, boating, and fishing. My father passed away too soon, but my mother is alive and stirring things up in the Augusta area also. She has been many things, including a world traveler, sky diver, competitive ball room dancer, and a Zumba fanatic.

Growing up, I studied a lot and always had good grades to prove it. I was also very interested in music. I played the piano from a very young age. In my middle school years, I began to study organ. I studied music until my post-college years. I still play piano. My music provided a way to serve in churches, even as a young and growing child. I love worship, and have much experience in that department. In fact, when I was a child, I would rather stay in the house and plan and carry out a worship service in the living room (with every detail), instead of playing outside. It seems like destiny that I would ultimately be a Pastor and be involved in planning and carrying out worship services.



This sound part sounds 'made up', but it is the truth as I can tell it! When I was a small child (about 5 or so, and throughout my childhood), I would pray, "God, don't make me be a preacher, I don't want to do that." Wow! God gave me much latitude in that, and 'let' me explore many interests and avenues before coming back to the call that I had since childhood—the call to be a Pastor.

I was the Salutatorian of my high school, won a couple of prestigious scholarships, and went on to study chemistry at the University of South Carolina, and later advanced chemistry studies at Furman University (google it!). I began a career in the environmental sciences. Describing that journey can get pretty technical (and maybe boring), so I will make it quick! I specialized in analytical chemistry (primarily organic chemistry) using very, VERY high-tech equipment and techniques. When I have watched NCIS on TV, and they say, "we will have to analyze that by GC/MS", I actually know what those letters stand for and have extensively analyzed water, soil, air, haz waste, fish (and other animals) using GC/MS and other methods. I have worked on some "top secret" things, including, space shuttle crashes, World Trade Center/911 related things, explosive "stuff" for the government, and some nuclear affairs at Hanford, Los Alamos, Oak Ridge, and Savannah River Site DOE sites.

I moved on from the 'hands-on' chemistry into a management role. For about a decade, I worked for a British company on a corporate management team. My responsibilities and "assignments" were very diverse. I was often a "fixer". I would go into offices/laboratories, and work with the management group and team-at-large for quality, process improvement, custom service, and financial affairs. I traveled all over, logging 100,000 to 150,000 airline miles a year. The travel was fun but brutal. I poured more and more into my career, and my personal life suffered. I have lived in South Carolina, Maryland, Colorado, Minnesota, Washington, and Montana. I have also "lived" in other places in extended residency situations, including, Ohio, Nevada, California, Tennessee, Florida, and New Jersey. My life "came to a head" in 2011. During a time of challenges, trials, and discernment, in a most unlikely journey God led me to First Lutheran Church in Albert Lea, MN. I worked there for six years as the Minister of Worship and Music. I was on the pastoral team of 3 with 2 other Pastors. During that time, I also studied full-time at Luther Seminary, while I worked full-time. I earned a Master of Divinity from Luther Seminary. I worked very hard in seminary (especially juggling full-time work with school AND the commute up I-35). I excelled and found that my call was in-

I am passionate in my life and work. Many people throughout my life's adventures have used that word "passionate" to describe me. I am a committed ELCA Lutheran and have been ordained in the ELCA and hold fast to the Lutheran Confessions. I am a "meat and potatoes" preacher. There is no greater responsibility of a Pastor, than to stand before people and proclaim the Word of God, and to preach. I never take it lightly. I literally spend hours to days each week in open discernment and prayer about the "sermon". I am a teaching preacher also. I work hard to bring the Word so that everyone, regardless of their age or faith journey, can find a 'nugget' or message every week.

I love people and want to know every one of you! I will learn your names and learn about your life's adventures. I promise that I will always "be present" when you need me. I tell everyone, "I don't care if it is 1:00 AM, 5:00 AM, or whenever. If you need me, call me. I look forward to joining forces with Pastor Kate in visitations, pastoral care, etc.

I love every member of our staff. We have a powerhouse team, and I can't wait to work together. We have so many opportunities as we look for the future.

I want to thank the Call Committee (Connor and Jen as leaders!), and Rick and Linda and the Council, the Personnel Committee, and **ALL OF YOU** for opening the door and calling me to serve at First Lutheran Church.

Let's work to celebrate the heritage and traditions of First Lutheran Church, as we bind together in prayer and action in the direction that God is leading us for FUTURE CHURCH at First Lutheran. These will be exciting and amazing times, as the Spirit continues to empower us and move us into the future. **To God Be the Glory—GREAT THINGS HE HAS DONE!** Again, I am counting the days until I get there. Adult Education Committee debuted with bible studies and book club, and so much more. We are looking for a chairperson for this healthy committee, so if this is you, please call the church office!

Outreach leads us in awareness about the Blessing Closet's needs. We even had the first Harvest Dinner two years ago (since Covid started). Support for Salvation Army, Food Shelf, Welcome House, Matthew and Barbara House and so much more.

Stewardship Committee is expanding their invitation through recycling, the Volunteer Appreciation Sunday, Fall Appeal, and plenty more to come.

Finance keeps us financially sound and this year we routinely see an increase of \$10-12,000 in giving.

Personnel updated our Employee Handbook, reviews job descriptions, keeps up to date on policies, benefits, and salaries.

And do get me started on WELCA! They prepare for Bible Study, outreach, conventions, and offerings that help others. Love Days Quilters take scraps of material and make blankets that help people survive, school kits that help children thrive, and friendships that endure.

We've learned how to end well and start strong. This is my prayer for this present time in FLC's life. It means that I love you from afar and will keep my ear to the ground in my prayers, but we need to end our normal communica-

tion. I cannot come to FLC in a pastoral capacity. The space is the healthy way to make space for Pastor Tim who is the pastor of FLC now. We are all grateful for his call and the future you have together in ministry at FLC.





Inspired by the humble people he met during his ministry, Cesaro Gabarain was one of the best know liturgical writers of Spain after the second Vatican Council (1962-65). *Fisher of Men* is the original title of the hymn we know as *You Have Come Down to the Lakeshore*. The hymn asks us to follow Jesus with the same commitment of the disciples. The tune is reminiscent of the rocking of a boat. The hymn has been translated into more than eighty languages, and was used in the 1993 movie *Alive*, about the survivors of a plane crash in the Andes. "Lord, you have come to the lakeshore seeking neither the wise nor the wealthy, but only asking for me to follow, Sweet Lord, you have looked into my eyes, kindly smiling you call out my

name, on the sand I have abandoned my small boat, now with you I will see other seas."




